


1 Introduction to the European Parliament



Location P	 Strasbourg : plenary sessions Brussels: committee meetings, political group meetings etc Luxembourg : Secretariat General of the European Parliament
Role	 Legislative power : adopts European legislation Co-decisor with the Council of the European Union
Composition	 720 Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) directly elected 8 political groups

- 1 President & 14 Vice-Presidents
- 20 committees & 4 subcommittees

2 The EU elections

- European elections are held every 5 years
- MEPs are the only representatives elected by direct universal suffrage at the EU level
- The last one took place 6-9 June 2024
- Most EU countries operate a single national constituency which


elects **MEPs**^{*} for the whole country. Some are subdivided into constituencies, with electoral results calculated separately in each constituency

• **720 MEPs** were elected for the 2024-2029 legislative term

Patriots for Europe (PfE) new! (former ID)

« Make Europe Great Again » - Sovereignist, Realist, Patriot

President: Jordan Bardella (National Rally, France)

Represents 84 MEPs from 12 Member States:

- National Rally (France),
- Fidesz (Hungary), Christian Democratic People's Party (Hungary),
- the League (Italy),
- Vox (Spain),
- Chega (Portugal),
- Action of Dissatisfied Citizens, Oath and Motorists (Czech Republic),
- Freedom Party (Austria),
- Party for Freedom (Netherlands),
- Vlaams Belang (Belgium),
- Danish People's Party,
- Voice of Reason (Greece),
- Latvia First.


Europe of Sovereign Nations (ESN) new!

Co- Presidents René Aust & Stanislaw Tyszka

Represents 25 MEPs from 8 Member States:

- Alternative for Germany (AfD),
- Poland's Confederation,
- Bulgaria's Revival,
- France's Reconquête,
- Slovakia's Republika,
- Czechia's Freedom and Direct Democracy (SPD),
- Hungary's Our Homeland Movement,
- Lithuania's People and Justice Union.

Final results



2 First insights

- ✓ Majorities for compromise remain at the center
- Renew and the Greens lost seats, and Patriots of Europe emerged stronger from ID dissolution,
- ✓ Abstention remains similar to the previous term
- If all far right-winge— ECR; PfE, and, ESN rs would join forces, they could have become the second largest group in the EU Parliament (187 votes!)
- A more right-leaning European Parliament might mean more watered-down EU health policy:
- with the pretext of upholding Member States' national competence on health
- or market-driven forces instead of citizens/patients interests.
- A patchwork of national parties moving across political groups we have to engage on a more individual basis (and less targeting groups)

3 Impact on the European Commission's leadership

The current Commission's term of office runs until **31 October 2024**.



Ursula Von der Leyen (EPP, Germany)

Elected President of the Commission in July 2024 by the EP (401 votes)

In contrast with 383 votes in July 2019



The Council, in agreement with the Commission president-elect, adopts a list of candidate commissioners, one per EU country.

Each candidate is assigned responsibility for a specific policy area by the Commission president-elect.

----- We are here ------



A hearing takes place in front of the committee(s) dealing with the candidate's proposed portfolio.



The Commission as a whole, and its programme, is subject to the European Parliament approval (plenary vote).

3 College of Commissioners



3 Designated Commissioners



Olivér Várhelyi – nominated by Hungary Designated Commissioner for Health & Animal Welfare Previous Commissioner on Enlargement & Neighbourood

Civil servant for the Hungarian Government, Commission and Head of Hungarian Permanent Representation

No particular experience in health. There were no obvious candidates for the post of Health Commissioner, but the choice of Hungarian Olivér Várheyi might reflect the lower priority given to this function by Member States.



Ekaterina Zaharieva – nominated by Bulgaria Designated Commissioner for Start-ups, Research and Innovation

Lawyer & Minister of Justice, Foreign Affairs minister and deputy prime Minister

> No experience in health sector. Focus on energy, transport, and digital sectors.
